### Confronting the jobs crisis...

As the national jobs crisis persisted through 2011 and the early recovery from the Great Recession, the National Urban League declared war on unemployment.

We began the year with a 12-Point Plan for Putting Urban America Back to Work. We shared a dozen dynamic and imaginative measures both to rescue those most profoundly affected by the ongoing economic emergency, and to address the underlying reasons for the recession's amplified impact on the communities we serve.

We took the Jobs Plan on the road, visiting cities in New England, Ohio and Indiana, building a groundswell of support for a federal jobs policy addressing job training, incentives for investment and private public partnerships. We met hundreds of men and women struggling with unemployment, and carried their message into the halls of Congress and onto the national airwaves.

Later in the year, when President Obama introduced his plan for job creation, it included three components of the plan we'd shared with him: a summer jobs program for youth, an infrastructure bank, and direct job creation.

Meanwhile, our network of Urban League affiliates served as economic first responders, helping a record 2.6 million individuals cope with the loss of jobs, mass foreclosures and the stinging pain of seeing so much they had worked to build evaporate and erode.

With advocacy at the state and national level and direct social service throughout the network, 2011 was one of the most productive and impactful years the Urban League Movement has seen in its more than a century of service.

"I was not only homeless, but hopeless before I found NULITES [National Urban Incentives to Excel and Succeed]. I was ready to give up on getting an education. NULITES changed my life completely. My grades improved and I was able to secure financial aid to attend a university.

For me, inspiring people means being a positive role model, making sure that I complete everything that I set out to do, not only going and achieving my goals, but actually going above and beyond my goals."

## **EDUCATION**

Total served in Education: 172,825

# Every American child is ready for college, work and life.

#### In 2011:

- **Urban League Project Ready** programs in 26 local affiliates steered nearly 1300 8<sup>th</sup>-through-12<sup>th</sup>-graders toward academic excellence.
- **Digital Connectors** in 16 affiliates trained more than 400 youth ambassadors to promote broadband awareness and usage in underserved communities, resulting in more than 29,000 Digital Literacy trainings in their communities.
- The Equity & Excellence project partners the National Urban League with the national organizations that comprise the Campaign for High School Equity, engaging in research and formulation of public policy geared toward educational equity.
- Read and Rise programs in Urban League affiliates placed thousands of books in home libraries and promoted early childhood literacy through community workshops, parent circles, how-to guides and other grassroots efforts that reinforced the critical concept that parents are a child's first teacher.

Total served in Workforce: 302,396

### **Every American has access to jobs with** a living wage and good benefits.

### In 2011:

- **Urban League Entrepreneurship Centers** in 10 affiliates empowered more than 8,200 entrepreneurs to transform under-financed business into long-term, high-growth sector businesses, and helped win \$19 million in financing and new contracts.
- **Urban Youth Empowerment** programs in three affiliates provided case management, mentoring, internships and on-the-job-training for 300 at-risk youths. From 2004 to 2008, UYEP served almost 4000 youth and through two new DOL grants, UYEP plans to serve another 1000 youth through 2015.
- The Urban League Jobs Network, an online source for Fortune 500 and other corporations, hosts 100,000 resumes and has matched employees with jobs.
- Mature Worker Programs at six affiliates subsidized on-the-job training in community service work for nearly 1,100 people over 55, with 133 placed in with full-fledged jobs.

"For me, I knew that I loved fashion and that I wanted to help people, but I didn't know what direction to go in. The Mature Workers Program assigned me to 'Jackets for Jobs,' a non-profit that works with women seeking employment. My heart went out to the women, some of whom have been abused or homeless. It was such rewarding work, I was thrilled when I was hired as a retail associate after my training. Now, I'm able to give back to people and be sort of a role model to them.

## HOUSING

## **Every American lives in safe, decent, affordable** and energy-efficient housing on fair terms.

#### In 2011:

- **Restore Our Homes** kept 6,437 homeowners out of foreclosure and away from predatory lenders.
- Comprehensive Housing Counseling was provided to 26,814 clients, including 561 who purchased a home, 588 mortgage-ready homebuyers, and 9,329 who were fighting foreclosure.
- Asset Building and Financial Capability programs at 7 affiliates spurred positive behavior changes and measurable outcomes for 518 low- and moderate-income clients. Examples of these results were: improved credit scores, increased savings, and avoidance of unnecessary transaction fees.

## **HEALTH CARE**

Total served in Health: 1.588.938

## Every American has access to quality and affordable health care solutions.

#### In 2011:

- **Project Wellness** launched in 3 affiliates and partnered with faith-based institutions, schools, hospitals, community health clinics, and community leaders to support the health and wellness habits and to build health assets of hundreds of underserved and uninsured individuals and families.
- **Saving Our Sons** programs at affiliates in Lorain County, Ohio, and Dallas have helped over 500 men lose hundreds of pounds, which resulted in a 26% decrease in stage 2 hypertension and a 14% decrease in cholesterol levels.
- Way to Well Health Tour in 17 affiliates partnered with faith-based institutions, schools, hospitals, community health clinics, and community leaders to support early testing, prevention and intervention strategies for the underserved, uninsured and hard to reach individuals and families.
- I Am Woman program reached over 300 families served as it launched its third year of funding and support from General Mills.

- heard from social-services workers and the people they serve in North Canton


In Indiana ...
